*Shalom laYehudim, Shalom laBnai Noach, Shalom laGoyim.* It's the evening of the 2nd day, *dales Adar, tav-shin-ayin-beh, Parashas Taytsaveh*, the evening of the 1<sup>st</sup> day, Sunday, 22 February 2015, webcasting from the cold, snowy hills of Judea.

Well, today's top stories had me thinking of the 1930s and it feels as if they are returning, when the civilized world was so afraid of the rising tide of evil in Europe, the civilized world denied it; fear is again so much a part of our lives.

For those familiar with the greatest comedy album of the 1950s, done by those two Jewish comedians Carl Reiner Mel Brooks as the Two-Thousand Year Old Man - - their stand-in for a loveable old Jew who has seen it all -- he too said that fear was the basis of many things, like singing. "When you're in trouble," he said, "you don't say "Help...help." You say, *Hellpp!* And that was the origin of singing, songs such as "A lion is eating my foot off, somebody call a cop. A lion is eating my foot off..."

Fear is always with us and it is so frightening some times to face it. Take, for example, the other day former New York City Mayor Rudy Giuliani told a gathering he didn't think Obama was a patriot, so yesterday he was on FOX TV saying just the opposite. "He is a patriot," he said. Giuliani has received death threats for his views on these homicidal Muslim maniacs and I imagine his latest opinion about Obama generated more threats, so he takes it back, and thus is Western civilization wounded again.

Not that I feel comfortable attacking Giuliani because he knows that if he pursues this line of expression, he is going to wind up like Geert Wilders, the anti-

Islamic Dutchman who is virtually imprisoned by his security detail. He has lost his freedom.

It also happened to Salman Rushdie and this why the West simply has to defeat this generation's onslaught by Islam. I make the point in my book that the PLO won recognition from the Europeans in 1980 as a legitimate political organization, after about a dozen years of highly illegitimate, criminal massacres a.k.a. terrorism in Europe; in effect, the PLO mugged Europe into accepting the PLO's version of history which was as daffy as any of Barack Obama's excursions. Muslims have a big problem with history. They think that it is not something that happened but anything you want it to be.

And so now people in the West outside of Europe are also being terrorized by death threats like Giuliani into, metaphorically speaking, choking themselves, choking off the expression of their ideas and beliefs and opinions.

Fear seems to move as well Charles Asher Small who heads the Institute for the Study of Global Anti-Semitism who spoke here at the Interdisciplinary Center in Herzlia last Thursday; His view is that in the United States, the establishment Jewish organizations are quick to condemn anti-Semitism in Europe but at home he sees a constant and but unexamined antisemitism which the establishment is blind to.

For example, the establishment says nothing when the U.S. dialogues with the Muslim Brotherhood and Iran; you've seen those pictures of John Kerry chatting amiably with his Iranian counterpart. This establishment says nothing when a topic for discussion between them should be the genocidal antisemitism preached by the Iranians who are Shiites and the Sunni Brotherhood with whom the administration met at the end of January.

True, I can't see any of the IBJs (Inside the Beltway Jew) like Abe Foxman going public in anger at the horror of the U.S. government dealing with these groups as looney tunes about Jews as the Nazis ever were. Charles Small said, "To not deal with antisemitism is not only immoral but I would call it, and I am coining a phrase, "institutional anti-Semitism" And he openly acknowledged the borrowing of the phrase "institutional racism" against Negroes from the 1960s. He likened dealing with these groups to dealing with South Africa's apartheid regime without mentioning racism. To discuss anything with the Iranians and the Brotherhood with their antisemitism is bizarre.

But then, in this same piece in JPost today, Small agreed with David Hazony, an establishment voice in his own right, who like himself is dependent on the contributions of the wealthy, said, "The myth of the centrality of Israel to the world's problems is now a common perception in certain policy and academic circles, and it is functionally antisemitic and that those who believe in it are spreading a modern version of the ancient trope of Jewish complicity in all the world's problems even when they themselves are not antisemitic."

What? Excuse me, this is saying a thing and then walking it back immediately. He says this is a common perception in certain circles but those who spread this perception may not themselves be antisemitic. Why? Because they don't know any better?

Sorry, but in every generation anti-Jewitis is believing in outlandish accusations of Jewish guilt, like after the Gulf War of 1991 when those two fellow American Episcopalian aristocrats George Bush, 41 and his vizier James Baker pointed to Israel as the source of Middle Eastern instability, when Israel and its self-defense had absolutely nothing to do with Saddam Hussein's rape of Kuwait that year.

And here is another case of fear, from the Gatestone site, one of their correspondents in Scandinavia. It seems that following the attack in Copenhagen last week, the first question a journalist asked the Danish prime minister was, "How do you think this is going to affect the Muslims in Denmark?"

This sounds like a soul mate of Imam Barack Obama who sees it as his job, following horrors done in the name of Islam by practicing Muslims, to express concern for Muslims lest they be the target of bigots.

The Gatestone correspondent, Lars Hedegaard, noted that instead of the first question being concern for the Muslims in Denmark as potential targets for angry Danes, the first question should have been, "What are you doing to do to protect us from this Islamist savagery."

Likewise, a week ago in Copenhagen, the Jewish security guard was murdered by what was described as a Danish citizen of Balestinian origin, the day after he murdered a Dane at that cultural event dedicated to free speech, with three policemen wounded by him before they killed him, a spokesman for the main, liberal opposition party in Denmark went on television and said, "We are dealing with a small group that is abusing the Koran," with Lars Hedegaard commenting sarcastically, "Once again we are faced with one or more Muslims who have completely misunderstood their own religion. In other words, Danes have nothing to fear from the fast growing number of Muslims or the spread of Islam."

Well put. Here is yet another case of a liberal politician, pretty much like Barack Obama, who responds to the latest horror of terror murder of the innocent by asking people not to think poorly of Islam.

And exactly like Imam Barack Hussein, here was this Dane willy-nilly pretending to know what is in the Koran and that these murderers are abusing it.

Give me a break. No doubt Barack Obama remembers the few prayers Muslims learn to say by heart and other snippets of his boyhood years in Indonesia in Muslim schools, but other than that, who is he to set himself up as an expert on what the Koran really contains and what it does not?

Here too, leastwise in Denmark, fear may be a major factor, for the human brain is capable of unconsciously organizing information such as the common knowledge in all these European countries with major Muslim neighborhoods and their growing size,

and the common sense observation that these neighborhoods are so different from traditional European neighborhoods. The unconscious mind “sees” the danger if the conscious mind does not.

That is what seems have been going on in Europe in the 1930s. And here we are two generations later with fear of Islam paralyzing and freezing the mind, heart and soul.

Yes, fear controls and deadens.

Here in Israel no one has to be a big expert on foreign affairs to see the daily progression in Iran towards its goal of creating an arsenal of atomic bombs with delivery systems of course, one of whose small bombs could be enough to destroy, G-d forbid, what we Jews have resurrected here over the last 150 years. It would be another horrible mass massacre of Jews like so many in our history, and worse.

And what is Israel up to this week? Well, the prime minister and his wife may be indicted for the criminal retention of plastic bottle deposits that had been returned and other financial corruption having to do with, it seems to be, spoiling themselves with comforts in their two homes, official and private.

No one is suggesting they took bribes like Olmert. It also seems so petty. The Prime Minister carries on his shoulders the defense of this community of 6 million Jews and that he and his wife may be guilty of such excesses as crimes, well, I can live with that. Of course, it is election time and it simply pathetic that the opposition is carrying on as if this were Watergate, instead of proposing alternative and superior policies to those of Likud.

Worse, with the threat of a nuclear Iran drawing closer every day, last night one of the aspirants to be prime minister of the State of Israel, Tsipora Bas Eitan, went to a sodomite bar to dance with the sodomites and promise them legal so-called gay marriage. She told those in the audience that she would “put an end to this period of darkness, racism and discrimination, commencing a period of light, love and equality.”

Heaven help us when the opposition in this country is so over its head. She of course was responding to last week’s internet video posting to an Israeli website by a woman candidate, Yehudit Shalit, of the Jewish Home Party, a religious woman who is a member of the Takana Forum of religious men and women who fight to end sex abuse in this community. In the video, she ruled out same-sex marriage, with no explanation but a year ago when interviewed on radio said this: “I want to talk about an aspect of this issue on which liberal, secular society expresses no viewpoint...I want to talk about the significance of legislating in favor of same-sex marriage -- in other words, promoting the homo-lesbian agenda by legislation. Public discourse is changing, creating a social climate that promotes a public climate of homo-lesbian ideas, making them progressive and legitimate...If we join in creating this climate of homo-lesbianism and the phenomenon of remaining single

until late in life and marrying late, we cannot ignore that demographically, we are talking about the suicide of certain collectives.”

And at this point in the interview, her Enlightened host insisted that family was a matter of choice and that gay people had not chosen to be gay and he said he would tolerate such statement on his show. So she began talking of the birthrate in general.

Yeah, her party leader Bennett, I think, has tried to tread the middle ground on this issue. As an Orthodox Jew he cannot approve of gay marriage but he is willing to recognize some kind of legal status.

And I contend this is another case of fear at the controls. Those demanding society at large recognize the rightness of sodomy simply cannot tolerate rational discussion about it for that could lead to exposing the lunacy of it all. I think historians are agreed -- leastwise they used to be for centuries -- that Greece and Rome disappeared precisely because they became sexually degenerate, which is one way of saying they ceased to generate new generations of themselves. You know, in an automobile you can accelerate or decelerate, and in sexual matters one can generate or degenerate. Hence, that alternate term for sodomites as degenerates.

For sure, it is no longer, I think, a matter of dispute that in every West European country traditionally Christian for a thousand years, sometimes two thousand years, this population is committing suicide via its depressed birth rate, as the Muslims in their midst propagate wildly for they are polygamists -- which yours truly believes is one of their basic tragic flaws. The relations between Muslim men and Muslim women, Muslim men and Muslim boys, are perverse. And that I believe leads to an absence of pity among the men and to cruelty among the men toward one another. What they lack is the feminine touch. A Haredi from birth friend who grew up with a passel of brothers and sisters said it is good for boys to have sisters who teach them how to behave.

And here is Tsipora the would-be prime ministress of the people who gave the world the Bible that unlike Greco-Rome culture rejected homosexuality unconditionally, dancing with the men and boys of Sodom which can never be a good thing, never a healthy thing for society.

And that she does this, as the top story here remains the rising temperature between Israel's prime minister and the secret Muslim saboteur in the White House, Bibi's speech...they are not going to boycott AIPAC...well...

Speaking of which, the website American Thinker has indicated that a piece of mine may soon appear in which I pass on what you all have heard from me, if not from others: I focus on the first ten minutes of the Obama presidency when in his inaugural address he bashed the Jews, and then the next day made his first phone call as president to the Holocaust-denying murdered Abbas.

The piece also refers to that mindboggling speech that he gave four months later in Cairo that was chock full of perversions of history and intended to make Islam look good. That is his job in his own eyes, I think, to soften up Americans to the presence of his moon-worshipping co-religionists. That and running out the clock, so to speak, on Iran.

Israeli Nobel Prize winner for Game Theory Moshe Aumann said not long ago that this has been Israel's greatest mistake, and I agree. That is why I wrote the book. Starting in 1969, the UN began calling the Arabs here, as they never had been, "Balestinians" with Israel's post-Jewish post-Zionists going along with the game thinking it would be easier to make peace if they did that.

Like that same year, out of a sodomite bar in Greenwich Village the habitués burst forth in a riot and declared, "We are not sodomites, we are gay."

Likewise, they came up with the pseudo-psychiatric category of "homophobia." You know like agoraphobia, fear of being outside in public and acrophobia, fear of heights and claustrophobia, fear of being closed in. A phobia is an irrational fear of something, in this case fear of sodomy. That is irrational, the sodomites said, and never mind the outbreak dozen years later of the AIDS crisis which resulted in terrible suffering and cost the society billions.
