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# DeProgram Program

*From the Mind of Sha'i ben-Tekoa*

*Transcript*

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*Shalom laYehudim, Shalom laBnai Noach, Shalom laGoyim.* It is the evening of the 6th day, *gimmel bekhodesh Mar Khesbvan, Parashas Noach, taf-shin-peh*, 5780, the evening of the 5th day, Thursday, 31 October, 2019, webcasting from the hills of Judea struggling to survive the decadent culture of the Left.

So, this week's brouhaha erupted two evenings ago in Petach Tikva at a rally in support of Prime Minister Netanyahu defending himself against accusers who cannot distinguish between an imperfect person and a criminal who has wounded the State of Israel in some way. No charge like that has been levelled at him, really. And not surprisingly, it is another instance of a post-Jewish Israeli culture mimicking life in the Left's "true" promised land, the USA today obsessed with accusing the president there of treason with no basis for that either. And not only that; notice how Trump's accusers have accused him of their own evil. There is video for all the world to see of Obama running for election before the 2012 elections unaware of a hot mic and camera telling the foreign minister of Russia, in so many words, of wanting to help Mr. Putin but the elections force him to appear to care what the Americans think, but he would be more flexible afterwards.

It was the Russians who also forked over millions into the Clinton Foundation and paid King Billy the Kinky a half-million dollars for a 50-minute talk. Likewise, Obama's fellow Communist sympathizer John Brennan who ran the CIA – that is how corrupt the West has become -- and voted for the Communist Party in the 1970s has been the most vicious in accusing Trump of being a Russian agent, and who believably is, I think, a secret convert to Obama's Islam. Repeatedly on CNN he has called Trump a traitor, because, Brennan, is the traitor. And so, in Israel the most vigorous enemies

of Bibi are those who despite the truth continue to accuse Netanyahu every year at this time of inciting people to murder Rabin.

This is the historical “truth” in the Rabin camp and devotees, their way of thinking, which I find simply shocking in its dishonesty. It implies first of all that Bibi spoke like a Hitler shamelessly inciting people to murderous hatred. That cannot be true because Bibi is not an idiot. Even if he wanted Rabin to be assassinated, you don’t speak like that in public as the Rabin camp, the Israeli Left, accuse him of doing.

And there at the rally Tuesday night was Mordechai Kedar, a professor at Bar-Ilan now, who did speak openly a popular theory of the right since 1995, that Yigal Amir did not kill Yitzhak Rabin but a bodyguard did. Kedar called the true assassin a man with the same initials as Rabin, which people understand to refer to Yoram Rubin. But beyond the actual killer, Kedar said, “The person behind this thing was apparently a leading politician who wanted to eliminate Yitzhak Rabin because he wanted to exit the Oslo Accords.” Kedar went no further than that. It was not clear who “he” had in mind, but as I will lay out, I could see Uncle Shimon (Peres) in that role. Kedar went on, “For 24 years the right has been tarnished, my Bar-Ilan University has been tarnished, we have all been tarnished.” Yigal Amir who was a student there, “didn’t do it.” He is sitting in solitary confinement. Why solitary? So that he won’t tell the truth to anyone.” Moti Kedar called for a “real investigation of Rabin’s murder.”

And for speaking this theory in public, his employers at Bar-Ilan University, I imagine their knees knocking, demanded that he be called in for a reprimand, when similar provocative opinions have been voiced by other Bar Ilan staffers who never were called in.

Prime Minister Netanyahu instantaneously disassociated himself from Kedar’s remarks. The university likewise issued a serious rejection of his views as unrepresentative of the university. At first, it was mis-reported that he was denied a trip abroad to some conference as punishment, when later the truth came out that the trip was cancelled a week ago having nothing to do with his remarks on Tuesday night.

In any case, thousands of people have signed an online petition supporting Prof. Kedar, formerly a 25-year veteran of IDF intelligence. If you have not had the pleasure, there is a YouTube of him on Al-Jazeera in fluent Arabic, with over a million hits, it is a hoot to watch him argue with and put down his Arab interviewer.

I met him for the first time some five years ago. We both spoke at a failed rally in T-A for Israeli sovereignty in Judea and Samaria. On Tuesday evening in Petach Tikva, he told the crowd that top-secret documents concerning the assassination need to be declassified and made public, and made the obvious point that if they confirm the official story, no damage will be done. What is anybody afraid of? They will confirm that Yigal Amir was the sole assassin -- when Kedar thinks they will not.

Well, yours truly is constitutionally allergic to conspiracy theories because they always seem to propose complicated, super clever schemes and plots requiring a series

of successes, so I have never doubted that Amir did what he claims he did and was convicted of doing. The alternate scenario depends on so many things that could have gone wrong. I prefer to apply Occam's Razor, as it is called in philosophy; I opt for the simplest explanation.

But where I do support Moti Kedar in his views is that Rabin was the target politically of the Left at this point in his career because by November 4, 1995 when he was murdered, 16 months after he and cohorts opened the doors to the country to Arafat and tens of thousands of his barbaric, antisemitic soulmates, and the terror atrocities that occurred in those first sixteen months had turned many Israelis against the Oslo scheme. Remember, as well, that the plan only passed in the Knesset with the help of the Arabs; most Jewish MKs opposed it to begin with.

And now there was fear among its diehard supporters, like Uncle Shimon and his altar boy Dr. Joseph Beilin PhD, and the nasty post-Jew pundits in the Israeli MSM, that Yitzhak Rabin was no less so shocked by the results, he was considering cancelling Oslo.

And in February 1995, I published a piece in the Outpost, the monthly newsletter of AFSI, Americans for a Safe Israel that was mailed gratis to all members of Congress, a piece entitled, "Rabin's Palace Revolt." I'll read some or even all of it, and anyone who wants a PDF of it, just email me and I will send you a copy.

The piece begins, and keep in mind I was writing in January 1995 - "By mid-December [1994], ironically in the same week that Israel's prime and foreign ministers and their partner, Rabin, Peres and Arafat, the chairman of the world's largest terrorist organization, were in Oslo, Norway to receive their Noble Peace Prizes, when at home in Israel, dangerous signs of a rebellion in Israel's government were emerging because most Israelis were not duped by those stupid peace prizes. That ghastly charade of a ceremony in Norway notwithstanding, there was no peace in Israel and the Israeli public was swinging sharply away from the government. The members of the ruling coalition of Labor and Meretz -- otherwise known as the Jewish wing of the PLO -- know this, and were beginning to fear for the future of their schemes.

"Even as the *farce macabre* unfolded in Oslo, Rabin was putting the brakes on the so-called "peace process" because "Gaza-Jericho First" had proven to be a failure. Fearful of more casualties, Rabin was calling a halt. Everyone could clearly see that all he and Peres and Beilin had accomplished was to re-create the wild and wooly terrorist state-within-a-state of south Lebanon, 1970-82, and relocate it just down the road from Tel-Aviv and some thirty minutes from Jerusalem. The security situation had deteriorated and everyone knew it.

"Rabin admitted as much when he announced that the next stage of the Oslo process would not proceed. Stage Two called for more military withdrawals but on a much grander scale, as a prelude to Arab elections, but Rabin rightly had no faith that people's lives would not be imperiled by a further retreat by the IDF.

“And because of his hesitancy, the Israeli Left became anxious. Some of them had come to believe they had in Rabin a perfect “Manchurian candidate,” an Othello to left-wing ideologue Yossi Sarid’s Iago, Rabin’s principal adviser on the PLO. In him, they had an Israeli general most famous for his collapse in 1967, which followed his timidity in battle in 1948 and was followed by his retreat from Lebanon in 1985. This borderline alcoholic, known for a lifetime of psychological and military retreats, was actually putting the brakes on handing over Judea and Samaria to the PLO. This made the Leftist edgy. Here was Rabin in retreat again, this time from his own Oslo process.

Continuing then from what I wrote nearly a quarter-century ago about Yitzhak Rabin, “The man’s performance of late has given the Left much concern. It is one thing for a brilliant, right-wing journalist Uri Dan to note Rabin’s “confused monologues” {and I cited an item in Israel Shelanu newspaper} and his agitated performances after the murder of Nachshon Waxman and 22 people in a bus in Tel Aviv. Uri Dan said there were worrisome signs of a possible “short circuit between this man’s brain and his mouth,” {and I add right now he was not verbally adept} and quite another for a Gideon Samet, a paragon of left-liberal pieties, the deputy editor of the staid Haaretz, to shock the nation on December 23, 1994 by calling for Rabin’s resignation.

“Writing in Haaretz, which is a political and cultural clone of the New York Times, Gideon Samet judged Rabin to be a spent force. Although portraying himself as one of Yitzhak’s earliest supporters, Samet said the time had come to signal “the beginning of the end of Rabin the Navigator.” Samet sees “hard decisions ahead, such as grasping the ‘burning iron brand’ of uprooting settlements and speaking plainly and publicly about the coming Palestinian state.”

“This last sentence bears a second look in fear and trembling. Surely yours truly is not alone in never ceasing to be amazed and chilled by the depth to which the once anathema, conventional, world-wide wisdom of the 1970s and 1980’s – “The- road-to-peace-is-a-state-west-of-the-Jordan-for-the-ancient-Palestinian people”-- has penetrated the minds of Israel’s best and brightest, a la “Invasion of the Body Snatchers.” In the above paragraph the vice editor of Israel’s New York Times was actually calling for the creation of a PLO state in Israel’s backyard, and doing so as the height of wisdom, practicality and morality. How frightening it is that so many of Israel’s best and brightest have assimilated this non-Jewish wisdom.

“Samet is worried. He rightly observed that the Israeli street is not blind and that three recent displays of weakness by Rabin -- in the matter of the land dispute at Efrat, a stock market tax and cabinet appointments -- have made him a liability.

“Shalom Yerushalmi writing in Yediot Aharanot (1/6/95) also commented on the domestic crises and the burgeoning palace revolt. He noted the cabinet’s newfound

resistance to their chief's diktat; many have been complaining they would no longer rubber-stamp Rabin's decisions. (Why do self-described "proletarian socialists" like Rabin, famous for preaching rule by committee and calling everyone "comrade," are the least collegial, most Stalinist when they come to power?) Rabin's ministers now criticize him shamelessly, said Yerushalmi, and are no longer, as they were at the beginning of this government, interested in currying favor with the boss or preening oneself among one's peers as a Friend of Yitzhak.

"Rabin is alone and increasingly under fire. Leftist Uzi Baram, Minister of Tourism, also reacted to Rabin's helmsmanship by saying, "Those two weeks of (the cabinet appointment), of Eli Dayan's (budget revolt) and Efrat could be a fatal combination...I am worried about the decline in Rabin's power. The time has come to change directions...This is our only chance to struggle with Bibi Netanyahu [before the elections]."

"On the surface, then, Rabin's erstwhile acolytes were complaining of his tendency to shoot from the hip, his clumsy verbal blasts at enemies, his failing strength obvious in the land dispute at Efrat. Samet harped on Rabin's age and doubted he would have the youthful vigor necessary for the "hard decisions" (uprooting Jews from their homes).

"But in the end, one suspects that these are not the real reasons the Left is turning on him. Deeper inside these Israelis, like Samet, who have assimilated the mindset of a James Baker and his court Jew Richard Haas, is the unspoken fear that Rabin has shown himself still faithful to the Allon Plan of the Labor Party of 1967 and is not a true believer. No "Manchurian candidate" at all, Rabin recently asserted himself and shocked his backers by expressing his plan to retain the Jordan River as an Israeli border in a final settlement, with the implication of not handing over any more than 80% of Judea and Samaria to the PLO. This was in Israel Shelanu, 1/13/95).

"Far more than his erratic vulgarisms and weakness, this is what terrifies the Israeli Left most -- people who insist the Arabs must have all of Judea and Samaria, the heart of the Land of Israel and religious heart of the Jewish people, and that all the Jews living in these areas be driven from their homes.

"Whatever Rabin's personal fate, his legacy to date remains freighted with accusations of reluctance to engage the enemy in 1948, his self-confessed psychological collapse in 1967, his retreat in Lebanon in 1985, his retreat from Gaza and Jericho in 1994, and Heaven knows where else in the weeks ahead.

"It is also a legacy of firing on fellow Jews in 1948 and killing more than a dozen in the Altalena incident.

"Much Jewish blood has already been spilled in the name of his peace, and although one has faith this madness can never succeed, the question remains how much more blood -- a half-century after the Holocaust--Jews must continue to spill until this pathetic man goes home."

So that is what I wrote nine months before the assassination, and as I say, while I recoil imagining complicated James Bond-esque plots and maneuvers, I am with Moti Kedar in

entertaining the possibility of, as I said before, Uncle Shimon being capable of plotting Rabin's assassination in order to salvage Uncle Shimon's greatest achievement in life; dejudaizing Israel, liberating it from the Jews who were daily at that point reviving Judea and Samaria. I had seen him interviewed on PBS in the States two years earlier, in early 1993, when in secret Dr. Beilin and henchmen were meeting with the PLO monsters and plotting the future Oslo abomination, I saw Peres say at that time the purpose of Zionism was normalizing the situation of the Jewish people which meant living like all the gentiles in the West with a national identity separate from religion.

Shimon Peres was also nicknamed by his rival Rabin in the Labor Party "a tireless underminer," for in truth Peres had a history of opposing whoever was the prime minister and going on his own to sabotage the policy of the leader. Indeed, in the early months of Beilin and pals meeting with the PLO, authorized by Peres to do this, he never told Rabin and only at the end presented him with the plan.

I remember a photo of Peres earlier in his career and shaking hands with French president Jacques Chirac, that tall, aristocratic Frenchman into whose face Shimon looked like a star-struck teenager meeting some rock star. Peres also later on looked up to Francois Mitterand who advised him to do as the French did in Algeria when they negotiated peace with the FLN. And never mind that the FLN never threatened the existence of France and its right to exist.

I imagine Peres had no greater thrill in his life than in receiving the Nobel Prize from those equally tall and aristocratic Norwegians, those descendants of Vikings. Oslo for Israeli leftists was the end of being "a people that dwells alone," the end of being the world's whipping boy for its abuse, mistreatment and even cruelty to the Ancient Ones. The Nobel Prize was awarded to those two old Marxist-educated fools because they had surrendered the Zionist claim to the Land of Israel. Unlike the first Zionists who knew nothing of a "West Bank," nothing of a Eretz Yisrael without the entirety of the land from the River to the sea, Shimon and Yitzhak conceded it really belongs to the Balestinians who were terribly wronged by our movement for national rebirth.

So, we left off and not for the first time with the eternal sin of the Jewish people and its endless desire to be like all the gentiles, loved by the gentiles, which admittedly is understandable given the history of their murderous persecution, hatred and abuse. That is why is better to be loved by them.

And so on Tuesday, the municipality of Tel-Aviv said that by year's end, presumably the gentile year, fittingly Tel-Aviv will begin poisoning the atmosphere, literally the air on the Sabbath, with the fumes of free public transportation, and that it will be free is the most important facet of the story.

Remember, it was the previous, enlightened chief justice of the High Court actually bearing the name of Miriam Naor, which means enlightened, who in the name of the general human ethic of “live and let live,” ruled that it was okay for small convenience stores on the Sabbath to do business. And now Tel-Aviv is proudly fixing to further violate the Sabbath by running public transportation and significantly for free. Why for free, if not to entice people to avail themselves of the opportunity to violate the Sabbath? It will cost the municipality millions of dollars every year and even more when hooking up to other post-Jewish towns in the coastal plain with the same nefarious plan.

Of course, the promoters of this violation of Tel-Aviv’s first mayor’s views do not move them. They likely have no knowledge that the first mayor of Tel-Aviv, Meir Dizengoff, who although post-religious respected the Sabbath as quintessentially Jewish behavior and saw its benefits. But today’s Tel-Avivians of course are lying to themselves. They think they are providing a service for those without a car so they too can go to the beach in their bikinis like South Pacific pagans -- the very name bikini reveals this. But I think they subconsciously are just flipping the bird at the Jewish religion; this is what really moves Mayor Ron Huldai and soulmates for whom being an Israeli means no longer a Jew.

Likewise, Yediot today took note of the latest fashions in costumes in parts of Tel-Aviv for children this day and evening of Halloween. You got that? Israeli children marking Halloween. Children dressing up like witches and walking skeletons, carrying jack o’lanterns, with not one of these Jews in Tel-Aviv, I doubt, knowing Halloween is a Christian behavior. It is All Saint’s Eve, and the cast of characters, witches flying around on broomsticks, vampires like Dracula as a man and Dracula as a bat, all a residue of pre-Christian European folklore, remnants of pagan Europe.

Purim is not good enough for these cosmopolitans as a time for kids to have fun dressing up in costumes; they have to have Halloween as well because that is what their children see mesmerized by their smartphones looking at the Internet.

It was those two Jewish cartoonists in the US who dreamed up Superman who fought for truth justice and American way. What Israel needs is a figure a striving after truth, justice and the Jewish way.
